

Content Requirements for Qualified Admission
International Relations Courses

Each Qualified Admission International Relations course shall include instruction in all of the following topics:

- I. Theories of international relations;
- II. Historical background, including the Cold War;
- III. International law;
- IV. International organizations;
- V. Armed conflict and its causes;
- VI. Balance of power, deterrence, and arms control;
- VII. Political and economic globalization;
- VIII. Trade and politics, including economic sanctions;
- IX. Religious, ethnic, nationalistic, and humanitarian challenges to global order,
including each of the following:
 - A. Poverty;
 - B. Disease;
 - C. Militant ideologies;
 - D. Environmental issues;
 - E. Human rights; and
 - F. Terrorism; and
- X. Other related topics as approved in advance by the Chief Executive Officer of the Board of Regents or the Chief Executive Officer's designee.
