































Percent Meeting ACT Benchmarks 2019







Kansas is facing challenges in meeting its postsecondary goals

- The population of Kansas is projected to decrease in 85 counties (2014-2044).
- The racial/ethnic characteristics of Kansans are changing.
- Since 2010 Kansas grew by 1.8% (52,341)
 - 47,303 more Hispanic residents
 - 11,315 more Asian residents
 - 31,718 fewer White residents




Projected Enrollment and Attainment Gaps of Kansas High School Graduates Enrolling in Postsecondary








College Students – Fall Plans





Strada-Gallup Education Consumer Survey Results


