- Strategic Field Experiences within districts in our Catchment Area




Pre-Service Educator Preparation: Simulations

- Simulations are immersive, practice-based learning experiences designed to replicate a wide range of authentic and semi-authentic classroom situations. These simulations provide pre-service and in-service teachers with opportunities to engage in instructional, managerial, and interpersonal tasks.
 - various instructional settings, including one-on-one, small group, and whole-class interactions
 - digital or virtual environments or in person
 - synchronous and asynchronous formats to accommodate diverse learning and teaching scenarios

This approach allows educators to hone skills, receive feedback, and develop strategies in a controlled, supportive setting that mirrors real-world challenges and complexities.

Pre-Service Educator Preparation: Micro-Teaching Simulations

- School districts and parents within the catchment area will be able to enroll their students for literacy enrichment and support in ASPIRE offerings.
- Preservice teachers will deliver structured SoR literacy lessons focused on discrete components of the science of reading
- GoReact will provide a secure digital platform through which video recorded teaching performances will be stored, analyzed and critiqued
- Exemplar videos will be used to enhance knowledge in required coursework
- Varied and diverse opportunities



Quality Assurance System: Data Collection and Analysis

- The College's QAS provides quality assurance and continuous improvement to all initial- and advanced-level licensure programs that lead to a literacy-related educator license. The QAS systematically ensures the preparation of knowledgeable, ethical, and caring teachers and school leaders who are highly skilled in the application of the Science of Reading, in support of families, and in providing community-based interventions designed to meet the unique needs of our catchment area, the state, and the nation.
- At its core, the QAS relies on relevant, verifiable, representative, cumulative, and actionable measures to ensure interpretations of data are valid and consistent.

Quality Assurance System: Impact Measures

- The QAS utilizes the Program Effectiveness measures include
 - (1) the numbers/percent of pre-service candidates meeting the standard on the state approved licensure exam;
 - (2) numbers/percent of elementary special educators, school psychologists, reading specialists, and elementary administrators completing state approved training (e.g., programs offered by the Center), or passing state-approved literacy exam; and
 - (3) KSDE reports on total number and percentage of students performing at a level 1 on the Kansas Assessment for English Language Arts in the designated catchment area, as well as reports on the total number and percentage of students performing at a level 2, level 3, and level 4 on the Kansas Assessment for English Language Arts in KSU's designated catchment area.
