

Your APPLY Kansas Event

1. Plan your Event

Register your event for the fall, Order Swag Items, Attend training, Select a date, and start planning!

2. Promote your Event

("Why Apply Day" is Sept 20, 2024)

3. Prepare Seniors BEFORE the event

Ideas: Make a list of colleges they're interested in, attend college fairs, talk about applications during classroom lessons, update IPS, and provide students with their transcript (GPA and class rank)

4. Host your Event & Celebrate!

(share on social media, use stickers/pennants, etc)

5. Student Sign out Survey

(Collect your data & submit your summary survey)

6. Prepare Students/Families for the FAFSA

2. Collect Summary Data from all seniors participating in Apply Kansas (by Dec 1st)

3. Celebrate all completed applications!

Systemwide Transfer

- 120 General Education and Introductory Program Courses
- The Transfer Kansas portal houses all Systemwide Transfer (SWT) courses approved by the Kansas Board of Regents, for which faculty develop and update learning outcomes.
- SWT courses transfer to any Kansas public institution offering an equivalent course.

Systemwide Transfer Courses

June 2024

The Kansas Board of Regents approved the Systemwide Transfer (SWT) courses listed below. Faculty representatives develop and update the learning outcomes for all the courses. A student who successfully completes any of these courses at a Kansas public university, community college, or technical college will be able to transfer the course to any Kansas public postsecondary institution offering an equivalent course.

Additional courses may also be eligible for transfer. Please contact the Registrar's Office of your university or college for more information. Students are responsible for becoming acquainted with the program & degree requirements of the institution to which they expect to transfer.



Systemwide General Education Framework Beginning Fall 2024





Math Pathways

- Math Pathways Aligning math general education courses to fit academic programs:
 - college algebra
 - contemporary math
 - elementary statistics
- Standardizing course placement criteria across the system (for gateway math AND English)
- Corequisite developmental support (for gateway math AND English)

Kansas Promise Act Scholarship

- Eligible institutions must have at least one existing eligible program and include:
 - Public community colleges;
 - Public technical colleges;
 - Washburn Institute of Technology; and
 - Private, not-for-profit institutions that offer eligible programs
- Eligible programs must fall under one of the following fields:
 - Information technology and security;
 - Mental and physical healthcare;
 - Advanced manufacturing and building trades;
 - Early childhood education and development; OR
 - Specific regionally-important fields of:
 - agriculture,
 - food and natural resources,
 - education and training,
 - law, public safety, corrections, and security,
 - transportation, distribution and logistics



Kansas Promise Act Scholarship

Refer to the full requirements of the program at https://www.kansasregents.org/students/student financial aid/promise-act- scholarship

Highlights:

- Must complete FAFSA
- Family income requirements
- Students must maintain satisfactory academic and successfully complete the program within 36 months
- After completion, student must reside in and commence work in Kansas and for at least two consecutive years following completion of the promise-eligible program OR enroll as a full-time student or a part-time student in any public or private postsecondary educational institution with its primary location in Kansas

Excel in CTE (Senate Bill 155)

- State-funded college tuition for high-school students
- Pays for approved technical courses offered by Kansas technical and community colleges
- Requires early planning, application & commitment
- Courses and grades appear on the official college transcript

 - Courses can be online see course list
- Not all CTE courses are Excel in CTE eligible:
 - Must be technical (State tiered funding defined by Statute)
 - Associated to a technical program
 - Check with the college to make sure the courses receive Excel in CTE funding



CTE Credential and Transition Incentive


- Senate Bill 123
- Intended to increase employment success of high school students
- School districts cover assessment fees for CTE credentials upon student request
- Credentials must be on the approved list (created in consultation with the State Board of Education, the Board of Regents, Secretary of Labor, the Secretary of Commerce and representatives of industries that recognize career technical education credentials)


