


Pre-Service Educator Preparation: Current Programs

Rigorous coursework and in-depth application in various classrooms throughout the program.

- ✓ <u>Five required courses</u> provide explicit instruction and application of The Science of Reading elements and principles
- ✓ 2 field experiences (150+ hours) in addition to the student teaching semester
- ✓ 3 courses taught within a local elementary school for instant

Simulation Lab: The WU Virtual Training and Simulation Lab (VTSL) houses a three-screen Multiple Interactive Learning Objectives (MILO) decision-based simulator

Timekettle Translators support bilingual conversations (in 40 languages and 93 dialects) to create a seamless connection that is simultaneous.

WU pre-service educators already use these devices when working with ELLs and families resulting in a positive impact on communication and relationships between pre-service teachers, students, and families.

Reading Specialist Master's Degree:

- $\checkmark\,$ 31 credit hours of coursework that includes
 - ✓ structured literacy,
 - ✓ supporting students with dyslexia,
 - ✓ supporting English Language Learners,
 - ✓ action research

In the past 8 years, <u>100% of program completers</u> <u>have passed the PRAXIS exam</u> for licensure as a reading specialist. Additional Graduate Programs with Science of Reading coursework:

Professional Development Program for Literacy Faculty

- Participation in events that demonstrate continued knowledge/application/growth in literacy education
- Open to all faculty at all universities, including independent colleges and community colleges

Science of Reading Faculty Retreat

- Multi-day "camp" for faculty across Kansas to share recent research, discuss trends, form new partnerships for projects, etc.
- Partially facilitated by national experts

Kansas Literacy Summit

- Educators across Kansas learn from state and national experts in the field of literacy
- Centers will share information (pre-service teacher candidate program improvements/innovations, in-service educator learning opportunities and support, research on assessments and interventions, new initiatives, etc.)

Literacy Podcast


• Focused on literacy in the state of Kansas, including at the universities, in the schools, in the community, throughout the catchment area, and beyond the catchment area.
