Cowley Community College (Julie Kratt)	ALP Co-req modelALP is Integrated Reading and Writing
Flint Hills Technical College (Leann Garcia)	At Flint Hills Technical College we have offered English Composition with Review for many years; however, we need at least six students in a course for us to allow it to go forward. This class has never had six students enrolled.
Seward County Community College (Sherry Moentmann)	We currently have three to four sections of the corequisite model15 with non plus and 10 in plus.
Garden City Community College (Veronica Goosey)	GCCC has a co-req model for English I and has an expanded one (3 credit hours) for the ESL English I and (coming soon!) English II sections.
Kansas City Kansas Community College (Faith Harrell)	At KCKCC, we currently have 5 sections of ENGL 101/co-requisite course (Integrated Reading and Writing 099). We are still figuring it out, but we have had good success rates for students so far.
Coffeyville Community College (Melisa Gunby)	Coffeyville Community College - embedded tutor with an extra credit hour per week. I think we're doing 3 sections this fall semester
Independence Community College (Bridget Carson)	At Independence Community College e are piloting a redesign of our Comp I with core this year as it hadn't been taught since 2016 due to staffing changes and load considerations- I'll have better assessment data at the end of the Academic year with two semesters.
Cowley Community College (Amy McWhirt)	We also provide an ELL specific ALP section at Cowley College.
Highland Community College (Mary Bryant)	We used the separate coreq class model for years and have now moved to the five day model this year.
Hutchinson Community College (Ryan Diehl)	HutchCC is using a co-req model too.
Emporia State University (Mary Beth Harris)	At ESU we are piloting two sections of CoReq Supported Comp in Spring 2025, 3 credit EG 101 with a separate support course using an existing course on our books; hoping to expand to more sections in Fall 2025 with new courses designed more specifically for this purpose
Manhattan Area Technical College (Rachel Ohmes)	separate co-req model
Wichita State University (Melinda Defrain)	At WSU we are offering a pilot class using the Co-req model. Next semester we will offer a Co-req class for international students.
Fort Scott Community College (Maria Bahr)	Fort Scott Community College has used the co-requisite model for 6 years with success. We use the 2-hour co-requ. ALP model. We usually have about 7-8 sections in the fall and about 4-5 ALP sections in the spring.
